

Elective Descriptions for 7th Graders for 2023-2024

Availability of all electives based on school enrollment, scheduling and staffing.

Not all courses listed may be offered

due to school enrollment, scheduling and staffing limitations.

7th grade students may take only one elective.

ART (Semester) Course # 2993

A semester course in art focuses primarily on the fundamentals of drawing. Students will have the opportunity to work through several projects focusing on shading, coloring, and creating interesting designs. They will be primarily working with dry ingredients and learn about creating realistic drawings, how to color, and how to establish depth in their projects. This course is meant to work as an introduction to art and is not the same as the year long art class. This course cannot be taken twice in one year.

ART Yearlong Course # 0501

The year long art class strives to build a student's drawing skills, working on basics like how to sketch and create interesting designs. Students will have the chance to work with a wide variety of materials, from pencil, to colored pencils, markers and watercolors. Students will have a chance to grow in their skill, whether they have no experience or if they enjoy art already. Projects are student driven, which means that they will have an opportunity to select their subjects for several projects while learning the fundamentals of art through demonstration and practice.

ART ADVANCED Yearlong Course # 0502

This advanced art class is a course that continues a student's education in the fundamentals of art. Experiences in drawing, painting, printmaking, jewelry, and ceramics will progress students into more elaborate projects. Students will also work within themed settings, including studies on portraiture, animals, and landscapes. Students in this class will have a chance to participate in art shows and will learn how to display their work in a gallery setting.

ASB Yearlong Course # 9193 Application/Interview

This course is designed to empower students to become effective leaders both on campus and in their own community. Students will explore various components of what it means to be an effective group member and leader through planning and implementing activities, programs, and events for Niguel Hills Middle School students and faculty. In addition to ASB, students will create the NHMS yearbook. Help capture all the excitement of the school year as part of the NHMS yearbook staff. Students will be called upon to photograph events, classes, activities, sports and more. Yearbook staff members work in teams to create an unforgettable yearbook that will be cherished by students and staff for years to come.

AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) Yearlong Course # 5446

AVID is a yearlong elective class for those students who have a desire to do well in school and look forward to attending college. This class will help students with those skills needed to reach this goal. Students will participate in team building activities, helpful tutorials and fun Friday competitions. Students will learn the techniques to help them be successful in high school and beyond. AVID is a club like environment, focusing on leadership skills. Students will learn time management and organization tools which will, in turn, help students with reducing anxiety and stress about school. Students will shadow at the local high school. In addition, they will tour local university campuses to check out college life. Join the AVID family!

AVID PEER TUTOR Yearlong Course # 1911 Teacher Approval An AVID peer tutor is someone that enjoys helping other students. They are patient, positive and an excellent role model. The peer tutors will be class assistants. In addition, peer tutors help guide students through the tutorial process and assist the teacher with bulletin boards, team-building activities, and many other fun things. They get to attend all field trips and get to be part of a great group of students.

BAND Yearlong Course # 0510

This is a yearlong course designed to prepare students for ensemble performances, solo performances, Honor Band auditions at the district, regional, and state level. Students will work on personal organizational skills to allow more productive use of available time for practice and homework activities. Performances will include 2-3 public performances, at least one festival appearance, a performance with Dana Hills High School for a football halftime show. Other performances e.g. Knott's Berry Farm, and other civic events may be scheduled as time allows.

CTI (CAREER TECHNOLOGY INVESTIGATION) Semester Course # M9253 This course provides students the opportunity to investigate careers and innovative technology used in high-demand employment sectors. Students will spend time utilizing these exciting modules to complete projects and work based learning activities that incorporate STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) concepts. Each module includes use of equipment such as 3D Printers, Robotic Arms, CNC machinery, Laser Engravers, Flight Simulator, Virtual Reality, and much more. Students will also learn related software such as CAD (Computer Aided Drafting) CAM (Computer Aided Machining) and Solid works, to name a few. This course will assist students in planning for college and career pathways throughout high school and college.

CHOIR Yearlong Course # 0530

This yearlong choir class performs music of many styles including Broadway musicals, pop, jazz, holiday, patriotic, classical, multicultural, folk, and music of classic and contemporary composers. No previous singing experience is necessary. Leadership opportunities are available. Students develop music skills such as sight singing (note reading), vocal production, and ensemble singing including singing in unison, 2, 3, and 4 parts. Students also learn how to sing and play ukulele and write their own songs. This is a performing class and attendance at 3 to 4 evening concerts is required. Additionally, this group performs at many outside events including festivals, Knott's Berry Farm, Disneyland, and singing the National Anthem at an Angels' baseball game. Students who participate in this class are eligible to audition for the CUSD District Honor Choir which performs at the Segerstrom Center for the Arts. Students may also be eligible for future scholarship opportunities in high school and college because of their involvement in choir.

HOME ART SKILLS Semester Course #M1953

This segment of the Fine and Practical Arts program will acquaint students with the Food Lab while learning about nutrition, kitchen safety, table setting, and table mannerisms. Students will experience practical application to accurately follow and prepare recipes. Students learn to be self-sufficient and have fun while learning proper knife and serving skills and cooking and baking techniques.

INTRODUCTION to ART Semester Course #7985

This art class is a beginning course that offers a broad exploration of drawing with an emphasis on line, shape, and color. This class allows students with no experience to learn the basics of how to start a drawing, refine their skills, and learn new techniques using familiar materials. This class is a condensed

version of the year-long course that emphasizes drawing as a foundation for each project and relies heavily on personal design and interpretations of the projects.

INTRODUCTION TO VIDEO PRODUCTION Semester Course # M2350

In this class students will learn the basics of the Adobe Creative Suite. We will focus on Adobe Premiere and Adobe Photoshop to build creative and entertaining projects. In addition, this course provides instruction and training in pre production, production and post production phases of the development of your videos. Students will also learn to design and print some basic 3D models on the 3D Printer. Students will use Adobe Photoshop to design and create their personalized T-shirt. The class will focus on student interests and how to capture and communicate these interests in the form of a video, a picture, a voice over, a 3D Print, or a T-shirt. Clear communication of student ideas will be the main focus of this class. Although not a prerequisite, this class will help prepare students for the 8th Grade Year-long Video Production Class.

MUSICAL THEATER Yearlong Course # 7982

The joy of musical theater is not only performing the songs and choreography, but the compelling music and lyrics that are an integral part of the storytelling. Students will focus on dance/movement, vocal work, and acting. In addition to performances, students will learn the history of the American musical and how the past has influenced the great musicals we have today. Our time together will culminate in a Broadway Night performance. No experience necessary for this class!

OFFICE AIDE Yearlong Course #1911 (8th graders will have priority) **Application** The Office Aides are an integral partner in the school office. They are the first to greet parents and students at the attendance window. They assist the office staff in delivering call slips, keeping logs of students who arrive tardy to school and issue tardy slips. They help parents who deliver students' forgotten items and assist teachers with copies and homework packets. They conduct tours for new students and deliver items to teachers and staff. If there is down time, students are encouraged to work on homework or read.

ORCHESTRA Yearlong Course #0520

In this class, you will learn a skill in music that can lead to a lifetime of playing. You will learn to appreciate all styles of music. This skill may open up opportunities for you in high school and may help towards college acceptance and scholarship money. Other performances e.g. Knott's Berry Farm, and other civic events may be scheduled as time allows.

Beginning Guitar Grade 7 – Semester or Yearlong Course

This course is for students to learn basic guitar skills including chords, strumming patterns, notes using standard and TAB notation. Students will practice using popular songs and pre-recorded backing tracks provided by Mr. P. Owning a guitar will be helpful but not necessary. Instruments will be provided for class use and practice during Sharktime or Lunch.

Advanced Guitar Grade 7 – Semester or Yearlong Course

This course is for students who can demonstrate skill in both popular and classical guitar, as well as in music-reading ability. Like Beginning Guitar, Advanced Guitar will cover classical guitar, guitar ensemble and popular-style playing, however, more emphasis will be placed on classical and guitar ensemble. Advanced Guitar, as a continuation of Beginning

Guitar, students will further develop technique and perform music in both popular and classical guitar styles. Students will learn to read out of 1st position, learn advanced techniques such as hammer-ons, pull-offs, muting and harmonics in will perform music containing this technique in both popular and classical styles. In addition to being a methods course, Advanced Guitar is also a performing ensemble. Students will perform in concerts either as a large ensemble or in smaller ensembles, such as duets, trios and quartets. Students will also have the opportunity to perform as soloists at these concerts.

Taiko Drums Grade 7 – Yearlong Course

This is a two semester class that includes STEPS students and general education students in a performance oriented percussion class. Basic instruments will include bucket drums and homemade bachi sticks (Japanese drums sticks). Traditional Japanese drums and standard western percussion instruments will be used. Students will study traditional Japanese aural tradition music as well as applying technique to traditional western concepts and notation. There will be a minimum of 4 performances per year. This is a chance to learn to play percussion instruments and assist STEPS students explore music.

PEER ASSISTANCE LEADERSHIP (PAL) Yearlong Course #1383 Application/Interview Peer

Assistance Leadership (PAL) at Niguel Hills is an official program supported by and recognized by the Orange County Department of Education. This class focuses on building leadership skills in students and teaching them how to help others and help the community through service learning. Students also participate in service projects for the community and the school. Throughout the year students will develop their interpersonal and communication skills, to foster community awareness, and to apply problem solving and critical thinking skills to peer, social and personal situations. Students in PAL are a visible representation of the school and coordinate activities with a goal of building a positive student community within our school. In addition, students work closely with our special population students on a weekly basis. Interested students will need to complete an application and have two teacher recommendations. An interview will be required. Space is limited.

STEPS PEER TUTOR Yearlong Course #1911 Application A peer tutor may assist the Special Education Teacher in preparing materials and curriculum for students with special needs. You may work directly with students by assisting them with their work in groups or 1:1. A peer tutor (with adult supervision) may take a student on a walk around the school if they need a sensory break. They may help students in the garden behind the classroom.

STAGECRAFT YEARLONG Course #M1875

This class is where we get our hands dirty building the sets, painting props, playing with lighting and creating costumes for our play productions. In addition to design basics, students will learn power tool safety, how to build actor blocks, flats and platforms. Our new LED stage lights will be a playground for students to create basic lighting needs and visual effects. We will explore how to repurpose costumes and clothing to create a look for the characters in our plays. This class is all hands on the tools, technology and materials that help bring a play to life. *Please note: This is not an acting or performance class.*

THEATER ARTS Yearlong Course #0540

The play is the thing in this class! This is a 7th grade production class with the focus on producing plays for an audience. Students learn acting skills through the process of creating a play from page to stage. Along with the introductory acting skills needed for a play, students also participate in production jobs such as directing, lighting, sound, set design, costuming and stage management, to name a few. Unlike the semester class, in this course students will apply their talent by rehearsing and performing a play for an audience. If you enjoy acting and love being in front of an audience, this class is for you! If you want to be

part of an ensemble that is a family where everyone belongs...this is definitely the class for you!! No experience necessary.
