Admission Requirements (UC, CSU, most 4-year Universities)

- Students must complete the following subjects with a C or better:
- A – 2 years history / social studies
- B – 4 years English
- C – 3 years mathematics (4 years recommended)
- D – 2 years lab-science (3 years recommended)
- E – 2 years same foreign language (3 years recommended)
- F – 1 year visual/performing art (art, dance, drama, music)
- G – 1 year college prep elective
